# 3.0 UPDATE FROM WLGA / Welsh Government

LR advised the forum of the following from WLGA:

• A total of 6 local authorities submitted Expressions of Interest to host the National Armed Forces Day celebrations which will commit to a 5 year cycle and rotate between participating authorities.. Caerphilly and 2 other Gwent Authorities are among the 6.

LR advised the forum of the following from WG:

• The results of the recent WG Veterans scoping exercise were highlighted. The brief is not for wider distribution however key points were discussed.

## 4.0 GUEST SPEAKER – Michael Allen – Veteran Project Endex

An update was delivered by Michael Allen on the Veteran project called Endex:

- Michael discussed his journey, and how he has used different coping mechanisms. One of which was building a cabin on the side of the mountain in Caerphilly.
- The project aims to help a variety of support to individuals who are in need of help, this may be (as an example) due to mental health issues, physical issues and or isolation.
- There will be a variety of activities including drystone walling, tree planting and an on site gym next to the cabin for veterans to use. This is also intended to provide a 6 week work experience programme in 2021.
- Over the next year to 18 months the project is aiming to partake in mental health training (MHFA) to Endex staff to enable them to train participants.
- The website is hoping to go live on May the 21st, there has also been national media enquiries which are planning to be responded to once the website is live.
- There will be a series of qualifications for veteran's available including mental health and dry stone walling.

## 6.0 GUEST SPEAKER - SADIE BALDWIN - AFF WALES

An update was delivered by Sadie Baldwin on Army Families Federation in Wales

• Sadie discussed her personal experience and support received from AFF (Armed Forces Families).

- Sadie informed the group that she covers the area that have an Army footprint in Wales and Borders. Annabel Ingram is the Regional Manager that also covers Scotland and Northern Ireland
- She engages with families to assist with enquiries/issues & concerns. Engages with chain of command, service providers & other agencies
- Her role is also to help families to access the right services and support
- The service is flexible and can support spouses and single people.
- The role also gathers information which is relayed to the regional officer and shared at a higher level; this is sometimes evidence or even questions.
- An AFF magazine is circulated to military families and advertisement from services etc is welcome. It is a free magazine and anyone can request a copy.

## 7.0 UPDATE – ARMED FORCES LIAISON OFFICER

LR advised the forum of the following:

- SSCE Cymru and 160 Brigade were successful in applying for a grant via the Armed Forces Covenant Trust to have 4 Regional School Liaison Officers which should be able to start Sept 2020.
- LR next work stream is to introduce department Armed Forces Champions and mentors. Torfaen CBC have agreed this in principle.
- Change Step have informed LR that the Caerphilly drop in has a low uptake. Measures must be taken not to lose this facility however there will be a need to amend frequency and location if this will help.
- VE Day celebrations for CCBC will consist of A memory wall will be on display in the Atrium, Mayor's lunch with WW2 veterans, a commemorative service (7<sup>th</sup> May and forum members are welcome to have a small display/information stand if required). CCBC will be working with Caerphilly RBL on a 1940s themed weekend at the visitors centre. Additionally pubs will be encouraged to join in on the Nations Toast.
- Covenant Local Grants has now closed. Wales faired well again. Torfaen CBC were successful for £10,500 and HQ 160<sup>th</sup> Brigade for Veterans' stories Video Project and VE Day 75 celebration event
- LR has asked ABUHB to consider rolling out the GP Accreditation Scheme

#### **10.1 Armed Forces Champion**

• Asked the forum about any celebrations/events planned for Battle of Britain. RBL indicated there are some planned by the RAF and will pass on the details

#### 10.2 Hire a Hero

• Unfortunately their annual Charity Boxing Match in Wellington Barracks had to be cancelled due to the Coronavirus

#### 10.3 Age Cymru – Project 360

• Project coming to end of original funding. There is however access to a small grant of up to £1000. Details will be circulated via the AFLO

#### 10.4 Royal British Legion

- Gearing up for the VE 75 celebrations in London where 750 Second World War generations from the UK, each accompanied by a nominated companion will attend a programme of events over the period 8-9 May 2020.
- Supporting the work of the Veterans' Stories Video Project (Wales) which will source and record witness accounts of tri-service veterans from all over Wales, with focus on their recollection of VE/VJ Day and what it meant to them. This will hopefully be available to schools in the near future.

#### 10.5 RBL – Gwent Secretary

• Discussed the press around the closure of the holiday homes and discontinuing the handy man vans. It was highlighted that the research suggested that the money was better spent on other projects.

#### 10.6 RBL – Benefits, Money and Debt Advice Service

• This service for Wales started January 2020. Already a busy post but please circulate details for any further support required.

#### 10.7 SToMP

- AJ informed the group that the project will be finishing Dec 2020 and unsure if this will change
- Usk and Prescoed (within Gwent) give regular referrals and have a successful pathway.
- AJ suggested that the Endex may want to utilise the veteran inmates who are available for community service to help with his project if required

#### **10.8 HMF Education Support**

- EA informed the forum that she will be covering the additional 3 local authorities of Gwent from 1<sup>st</sup> April. This will be in place until July. Her post to encompass Gwent plus Powys will be re-advertised in due course.
- EA stated there is still issues gathering the information on service children from the schools and this will be addressed again and the schools will be chased.

## 10.9 DWP

- DWP have received £5 million from UK government to have dedicated Armed Forces Champions in each area. Although the person covering Gwent was supposed to start in April there is a delay at present
- No planned changes to Universal Credit, however this time next year old benefits will start to migrate over.
- What would be helpful is if there is support workers with users that their name and details are annotated on the work journal in the job centre
