By reducing the amount of revenue funding available for grant support offered to external firms and organisations in the county borough to support business growth.

Through the UK Shared Prosperity Fund (SPF) programme a business support fund has been agreed which will cover the current and subsequent two-year period that will enhance the funding available to local businesses and eligible organisations to support business growth, sustainability and economic prosperity.

The grant support is aimed at supporting business growth to create wealth and economic prosperity which can have an impact on the well being of our community and to provide employment opportunities for people to prevent longer term problems associated with low skills and lack of employability.
