Dear Ms Harrhy,

I am writing concerning the financial support that Caerphilly County Borough Council currently provides to Citizens Advice in Caerphilly. I understand that it is proposed that there should be a funding cut from April 2020 of 40%. This follows a reduction in 2015 of 15% when Caerphilly CBC ended its cover on the CA's lease on its Bargoed premises, in addition to a 17% cut last year.

I am told that if the current proposal is enacted, the Citizens' Advice will have lost nearly 60% of its core grant over a period of five years. Such a huge reduction now, following significant cuts in the recent past, would have a huge impact on the ability of the general public to have face-to-face advice throughout the Caerphilly Borough.

Only the local authority currently supports universal access to advice. The direct practical result of such a cut by the local authority would mean the closure of Citizens' Advice's Risca office.

I would therefore respectfully ask that the above be taken into account when the local authority agrees its budget for the next financial year.
